Are you in need of an elective or have an interest in Women's and Gender Studies? WGST (Women's and Gender Studies) now offers a graduate-level special topics course. The 3-hour special topics course changes each semester and may be repeated for credit. The upcoming offerings are:

This Fall, WGST 6600: **Special Topics: Masculinity Studies** is offered 100% online and taught by Professor Rob Taylor. The course will examine the topic of masculinity in a variety of social arenas exploring the interconnectedness of masculinity to other relevant social constructs, with particular attention to the constructs of race, class, and sexuality.

In the Spring, WGST 6600: **Special Topics: Queer Theory** will be offered. It is also taught online by Professor Rob Taylor and is an introduction to queer theory, by looking at the cultural context from which it emerges, its central tenets, debates within a field, and the activist strategies that have been connected with it.
