3) Communication with Administration

- a) Dr. Carvajal reported the following:
 - 1) Dr. Carvajal reported that "South Georgia Leads" will be meeting on campus tomorrow. This is an economic development group focused on leadership and economic training for South Georgia. The meeting will occur at the STEAM Center. The organization offers training on these topics and will be housed at our Office for South Georgia Regional Impact.
 - 2) The legislative session continues and it looks to be a good year for the USG and VSU. We are increasingly confident in receiving funding for the performing arts center.
 - 3) Vaccine distribution is about to ramp up quickly on campus. We have a large supply of does and hopefully soon, the state will allow all adults to receive vaccinations. Hopefully even students will be largely eligible soon.
 - **4)** We are in good shape in terms of our COVID preparation plans for fall 2021. The plan is hopefully to return to as close to normal as we can.
 - 5) We can celebrate the reaffirmation from SACSCOC last week. We had a great visit with no recommendations for correction and zero issues of non-compliance. Thank you to Dr. Black and his team for a job well done.

- b) Melissa Wolfe, SGA President, presented the updated withdrawal policy recently approved by SGA. Resolution 21-03 which is an update to Resolution 20-03 requests an increase to allow students to take 10 withdrawals during their career (up from 5 now). The policy would require advisor input after 6 to control for issues related to abuse of the system and graduation and financial aid issues. The system

would implement BANNER flags and pop ups to notify advisors of concerning behavior, e.g. international students dropping below 12 hours/semester. (see attachment)

RESOLUTION 21-03

A RESOLUTION TO RECOMMEND CHANGES TO THE VSU WITHDRAWAL LIMIT POLICY

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of the Valdosta State University (VSU) Student Government

Association (SGA) to determine and state the official position of the VSU student body on relevant issues, and to ensure a fair and proper educational system for the entirety of the VSU student body;

WHEREAS, SGA recognizes the importance of a proper, fair, balanced, and updated system of course withdrawals, following the examples of peer institutions and their decisions, to discourage performance stagnation and promote student success;

WHEREAS, SGA aspires to improve, and exceed, the overall retention and completion rate of students at VSU;

WHEREAS, There is no current record of a university within the University System of Georgia

(USG) that has a similar process, and thus would be innovative and unique, which are values that Valdosta State University stands for;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the 2020-2021 Student Government Association of

Valdosta State University, on behalf of the student body of Valdosta State University,

hereby urges an amendment to the current policy regarding course withdrawals;

THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the VSU SGA is making the following recommendations to the VSU Administration:

- A 10-total withdrawal limit for students, allowing for 3-course withdrawals per academic year;
- Academic advisor intervention on the 6th withdrawal to ensure students do not misuse the system and/or suffer consequences to their financial aid;
- An appeal process facilitated through the Vice President of Student Success regarding the number of withdrawals per academic year on a case-by-case basis;
- The implementation of a feature within Banner to provide flags alerting academic advisors of high-risk students that withdraw from a course, to ensure knowledge of the situation and encourage communication between the advisor and the student;
- The implementation of a feature within Banner to provide pop-ups alerting students of how many withdrawals they have left;

THEREFORE, BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, the VSU SGA commits to working together

with Student Success, Faculty Senate, COSA, and the VSU administration to ensure a solution that adequately satisfies the issues at hand within the current withdrawal process.
