PROJECT BRIEF

Motion and video are a natural form of visual art making. Now that you've understood how to utilize Photoshop with the previous assignments, we will explore the options of 4D and motion through linear story-telling. Here we will learn how to create an animated 25-50 image GIFs through Adobe Photoshop's timeline functions. Your animation can be simple or complex - it just has to be intentional and hold our attention with a continuous loop.

STUDIO BACKDROP

You will utilize the photography lighting studio using a blank studio backdrop (white, gray, or black) and continuous hot lights to create your animation GIF. Please bring objects from home as inspiration.
