Valdosta State University Department of Communication Sciences and Disorders

The curriculum leads to a baccalaureate degree in Communication Sciences and Disorders. This program map is a semester-by-semester sample course schedule. The sample serves as a general guideline to help you build a full schedule each semester.

Your courses must be selected with your academic advisor to satisfy all course curriculum and other requirements. Once you start in the last two years of the program, it is important to take courses as listed since they are typically only offered once per year.

The Communication Sciences and Disorders major is a specialized admission major. All students must meet the program requirements listed below. There is no minor or concentration in Communication Sciences and Disorders.

Program Requirements: Students must maintain a GPA of 3.0 prior to enrolling and must maintain an overall 3.0 GPA after admission. If the GPA falls below 3.0, after the first semester of their junior year, the student will be placed on a one-time probationary semester. If the GPA is not raised after the second semester of their junior year, the student will not be allowed to continue in the program.
