One of the difficulties that students encounter while enrolled in an online program is the lack of face to face interaction. What we would like to do to effectively address this is by creating ‘meet-ups’ whether they be in person or online. As we reach the halfway mark of the semester, I hope everyone is doing well and enjoying their courses!

Here is a summary of the Curriculum Committee meetings during the fall 2016 semester:

The reference track has been under review in 2016. Dr. Ren has conducted surveys and focus groups to gather information to better guide the Curriculum Committee members on what changes should be made. The largest proposed change to the track that students will notice is the increase from 12 required hours to 15.

The management track will be the next analyzed for updates and possible improvement though it has not yet been discussed at length.

The catalog description for MLIS 7960 Field Study was analyzed to determine if changes should be made to allow for summer internships such as the Library of Congress Junior Fellowship. Internships were ultimately defined as advertised, competitive, and not in connection with the MLIS program. Fieldwork was defined as located by the student in connection with the MLIS program. Therefore it was proposed to create a course (MLIS 7965 Internship) specifically for these competitive programs.

## MLIS Student Reflects on ALA Volunteering Experiences

In January 2017, MLIS student Marie Day volunteered at the ALA Midwinter Meeting & Exhibits in Atlanta, Georgia. Here is her reflection on this experience.

I offered to be a booth greeter at the NMRT Resume Review Service Booth for two hours. It is part of the [ALA Placement Center](#). The [New Members Round Table \(NMRT\)](#) group is a section of the American Library Association.

I had wanted to go to this ALA conference since it was near me in Atlanta, but since I hadn't been to one before and I didn't have an employer to represent or specific topic to investigate, I wasn't sure what a graduate student would want to do at the conference. In the end I easily filled up a whole day by visiting a session and the exhibition hall along with volunteering and catching up with former coworkers.

I found that the Resume Review Service is well organized. Resume review is an ongoing service of NMRT and, in fact, some of their reviewers have been with them over ten years. I had a chance to meet veteran and new librarians who had offered to be available for half-hour sessions during the conference. The Saturday slots were almost all taken ahead of time, but Sunday had a lot of openings for walk-ins. The only problem I had was finding the location because it was behind a set of doors off the exhibition hall and not marked on the map. Fortunately, the Georgia World Congress Center employees were helpful in directing me to where I wanted to go.

If you haven't already taken advantage of the student membership rate to join ALA, I encourage you to consider it and add membership in the New Members Round Table for only \$10 extra. Their resume review service is available year-round to members. The atmosphere of the conference was bright, purposeful, and cheerful. I enjoyed the experience, and I would recommend it to anyone who has yet to visit an ALA convention.

## MLIS Graduate Presented at the TIES Conference at VSU

Denise Dimsdale earned her MLIS degree here at VSU in 2010. She presented at the TIES Conference at VSU on February 23. The TIES Conference stands for the Conference on Technologies, Innovations, and Educational Strategies. This year's conference theme was Re-Envisioning the Academy: Explorations in Technology, Curriculum, and Pedagogy.

Denise is the Education Librarian and Assistant Professor at Georgia State University in Atlanta. Her research interests include the expanding role of open educational resources in higher education. The title of her presentation at the TIES Conference was Using Creative Commons Licenses.

In her presentation, Denise talked about how creative commons licenses are designed to provide options for sharing original content and other openly licensed content that users may want to remix.
